Choose <u>two</u> characters from your novel and characterize him or her using the head template provided. One character should be on each side of the page. Please print on cardstock to avoid any bleed through.

<u>50</u> POINTS AVAILABLE PER CHARACTER (<u>100 TOTAL PROJECT POINTS</u>)

- Character's name is written in large font. (4 points)
- Include the book title and author's name. (4 points)
- Include two *significant* character quotes. Include the page number of the quotes and explain why each is significant. (8 points)
- Include three images relevant to the character and a statement of how each image relates. (6 points)
- Include three <u>character traits</u> (not feelings)to describe the character. (6 points)
- Briefly describe a turn point event involving the character. (4 points)
- \_\_\_\_\_ Identify the character as either dynamic or static with a brief explanation of why. (4 points)
- Use an attractive color scheme with virtually no empty space. (2 points)
- All text is legible, dark, and attractive. Final text is not written in pencil.(2 points)
- Head and backing are cut and trimmed neatly. (2 points)
- Error free in grammar, mechanics, and spelling. (2 points)
- Attention to detail, high quality of work, unfolded without creases and crumples. (2 points)
- Quality of work reflects knowledge and understanding of character.(2 points)
